SPIRITUAL GIFTS 101 Starting to Understand Spiritual Gifts January 2024, Westminster
Most of the definitions from the following list are summarized from Jon Thompson's book <i>Convergence:</i> Why Jesus Needs to be More Than Our Lord and Savior for the Church to Thrive in a Post-Christian World.
A) LOVE GIFTS (These manifest God's love in practical ways) Administration: "a capacity to manage details of service functions so as to support and free those in leadership to prioritize their efforts." -J Robert Clinton
Helps/Serving: "the capacity to unselfishly meet the needs of others through very practical service."-J Robert Clinton
Mercy : "to cheerfully and practically help those who are suffering or are in need." -Bruce Bugbee
Giving : "the capacity to give liberally to meet the needs of others and yet to do so with a purity of motive which senses that the giving is a simple sharing of what God has given." -J Robert Clinton
B) WORD GIFTS (These clarify the nature, action and purposes of God) Teaching: "the ability to instruct, explain, or expound biblical truth in such a way as to cause believers to understand the Biblical truth." -J Robert Clinton
Exhortation/Encouragement : "the capacity to urge people to action in terms of applying Biblical truths, to encourage people generally with Biblical truths, or to comfort people through the application of Biblical truth to their needs." -J Robert Clinton
Apostleship : "a pure leadership and expansion gift, pushing boundaries and overcoming obstacles as the Church continues its God-given work under the Great Commission." -Jon Thompson
Leadership : "to cast vision, motivate, and direct people to harmoniously accomplish the purposes of God." -Bruce Bugbee
Shepherding/Pastoring: -to spiritually care for a group of Christians over a long period of time

Key verse: Romans 12:3: "For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned."

- Note: Taking online tests or inventories can sometimes be helpful, but are of limited value. Therefore...
- 1. Pray and ask the Lord to reveal your gifts to you.
- 2. Ask other people what gifts they think you have.
 - (a) Others can often see things you can't see.
 - (b) We discern our gifts in the context of a community, not in isolation. (This also helps with accountability.)
- 3. What makes you angry about other Christians? (We tend to be most passionate about what our gifts are, and sometimes we don't understand (or get frustrated) when others don't have that same level of passion. Does this reveal something about our own area of giftedness?)
- 4. When you put certain gifts into practice, ask yourself questions like:
 - -Do I feel closer to Jesus when I do this?
 - -Do I see God's kingdom at work?
- 5. What makes you feel God's pleasure?
- 6. Start trying the different gifts and take note of which ones clearly benefit others and are for the common good.

Expect opposition. Practice discernment.
